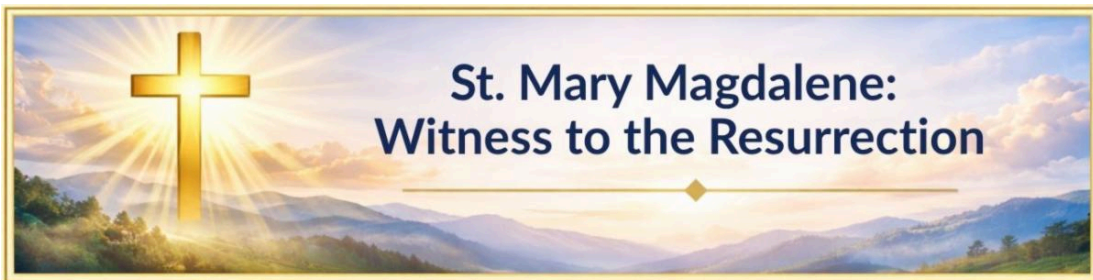
Easter is a season of hope.

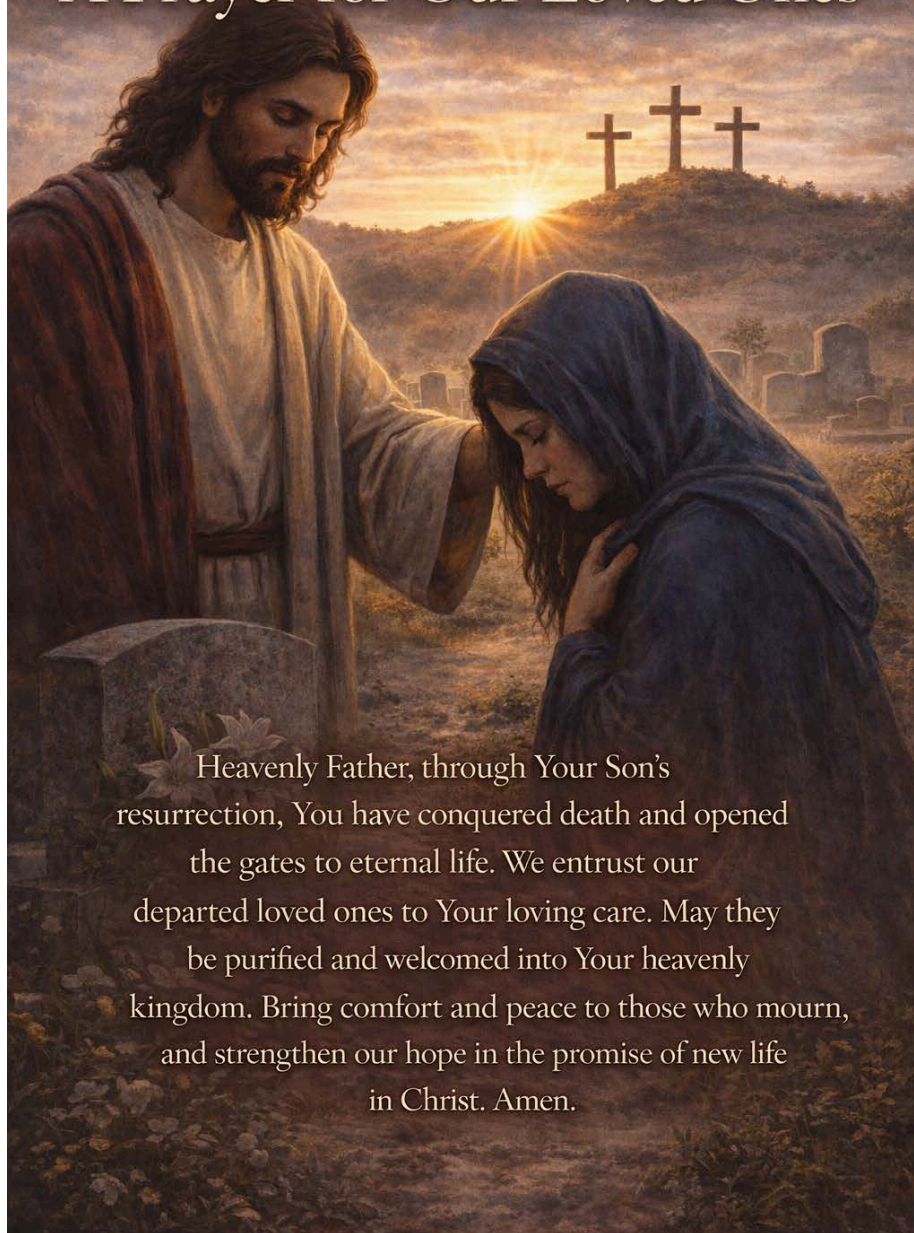




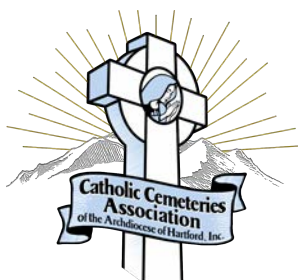
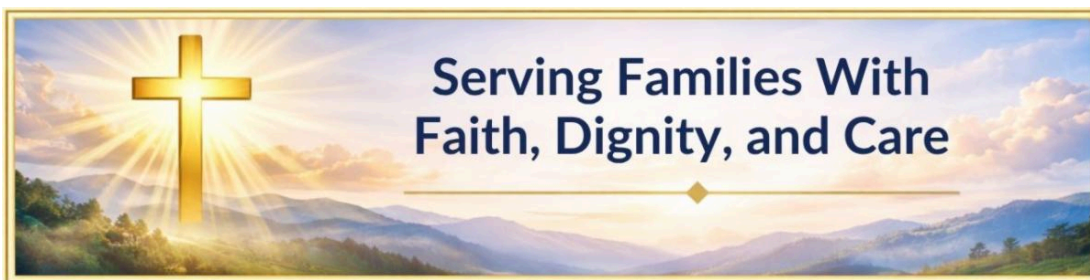
