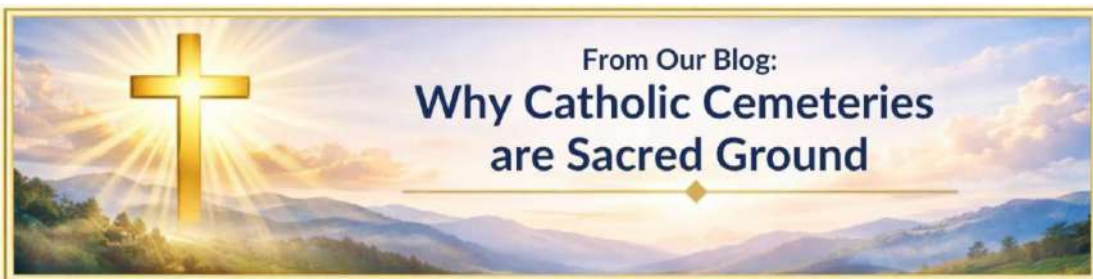
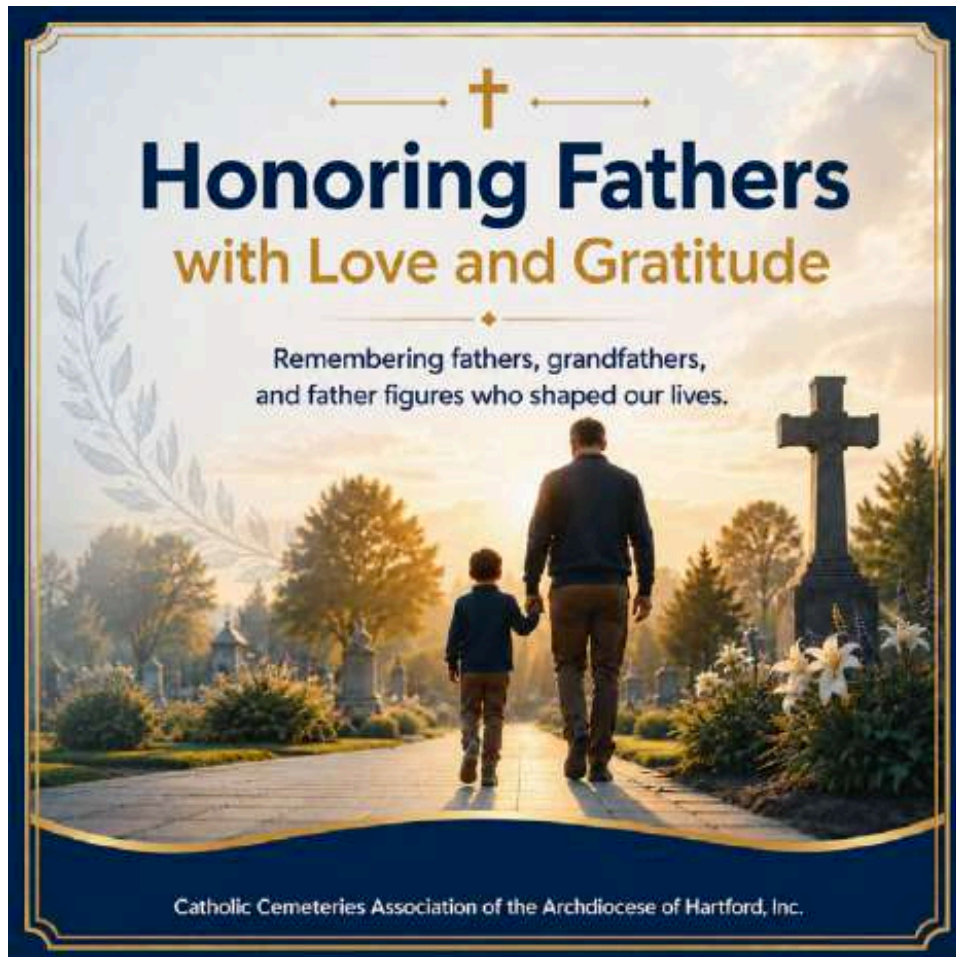

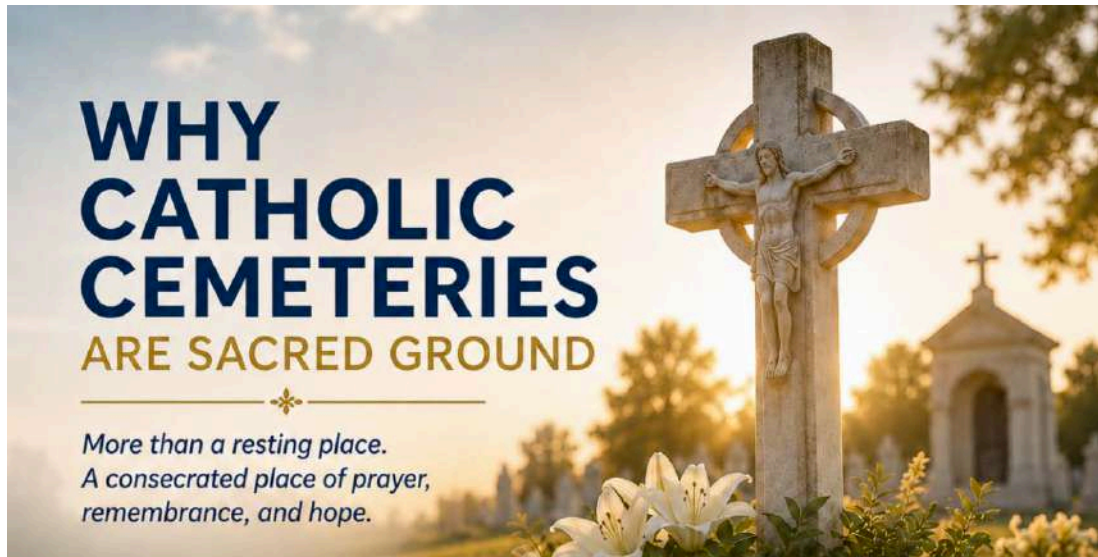

Cremation is permitted by the Catholic Church when chosen for reasons consistent with Christian teaching and when the cremated remains are treated with dignity, reverence, and respect for the human body as a temple of the Holy Spirit. The Church teaches that cremated remains should be buried or entombed in a sacred, permanent place, such as a Catholic cemetery, mausoleum niche, or columbarium.

In keeping with Catholic teaching, cremated remains should not be scattered, kept indefinitely at home, divided among family members, or placed in jewelry or other objects intended for personal keeping or display.

At Catholic Cemeteries Association, we offer dignified cremation placement options that honor your loved one and reflect the faith, care, and sacred tradition of the Church.

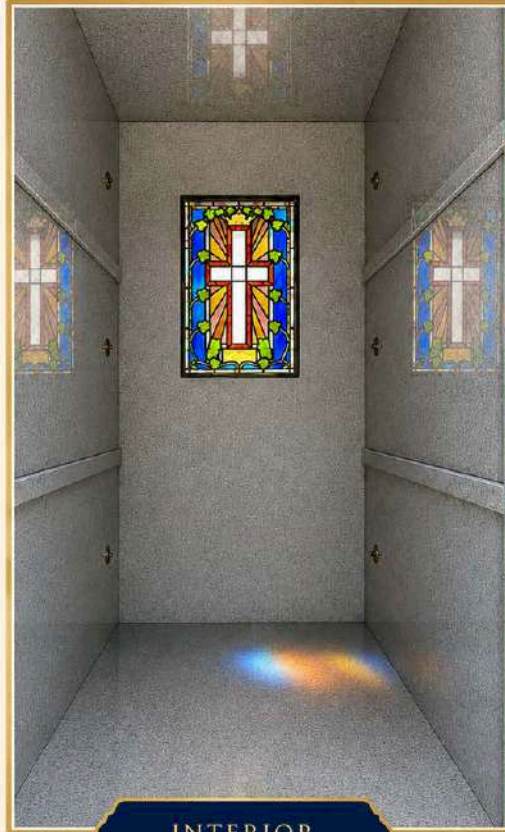

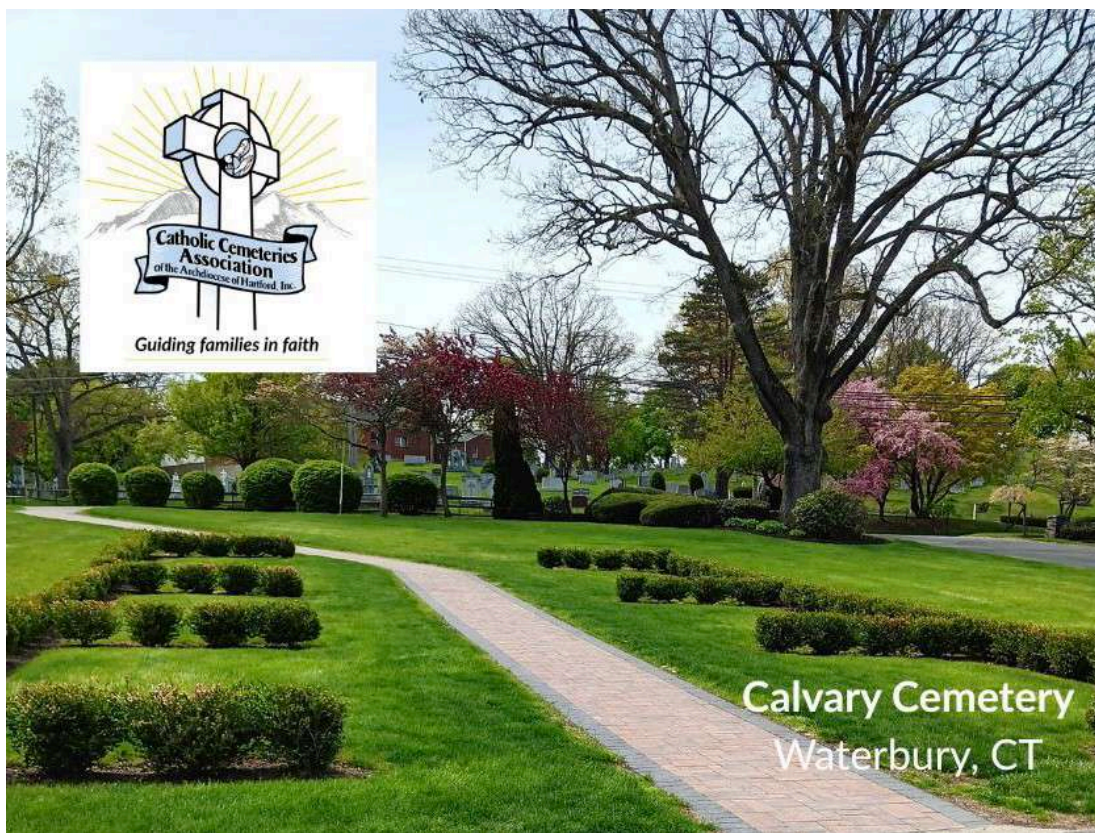

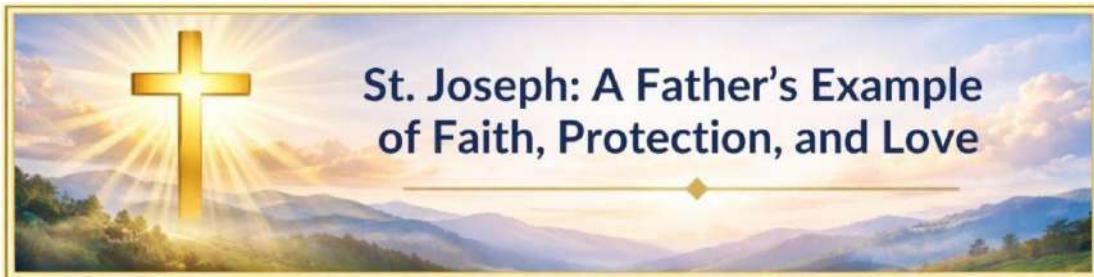
All Saints Cemetery - North Haven

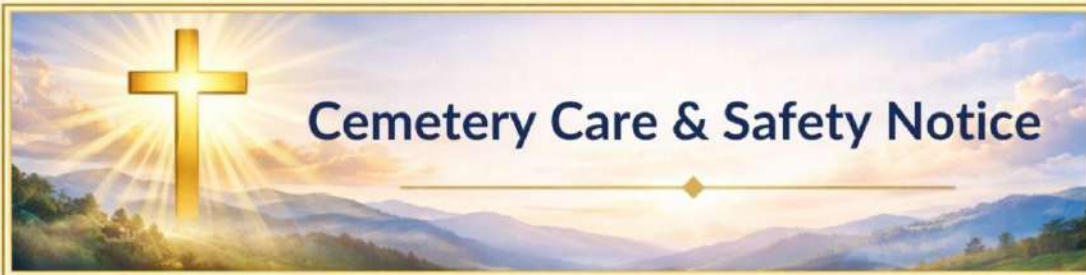

All outside vendors and contractors must provide proof of insurance and check in with the cemetery office before beginning any work on cemetery property.

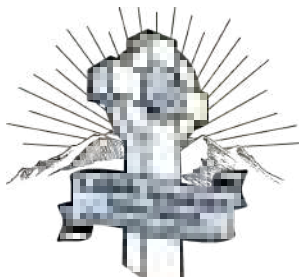
